Swiping Your Key Fob

Residents are encouraged to avoid making contact with the key card readers when swiping their key fobs. Ideally, you will receive the best “reception” from the fob reader if you hold your fob about one inch away from the reader. Making your key fob touch the reader does not make it read better or faster than holding it away.

This also helps to reduce potential damage to the readers over time and reduces costs. Each reader costs upwards of \$500 so reducing direct contact with them helps keep them in peak condition.

Wasps and Bugs

In the past few weeks there has been a large number of wasps flying around the decks and inside the units on the North Side (facing Victoria Street). As one may assume, these wasps are a large annoyance and hard to get rid of.

Given this, all residents are encouraged to keep an eye on their decks and units to ensure that there is no wasp nests.

Security Upgrades

The Strata Council is pleased to announce that all of the security upgrades have been completed. This includes putting knob protectors on the storage lockers, putting asticals on all exterior doors, increasing security to the external doors of commercial units that have direct access to the interior hallways, and increasing the overall security to the rest of the building.
